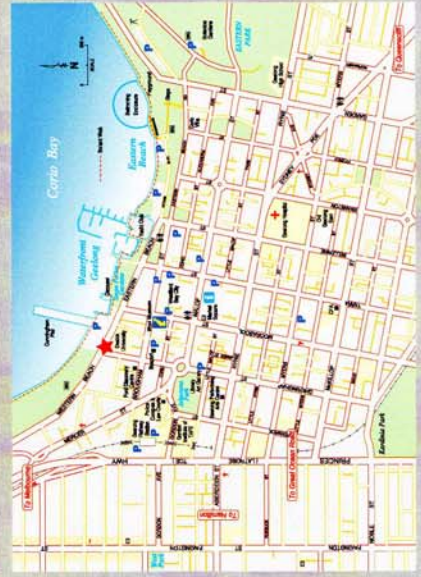
Geelong's central city and suburbs offer excellent shopping facilities, restaurants, nightlife and recreation on a par with any capital city.

- Drive the Great Ocean Road to the Twelve Apostles for an unforgettable experience.

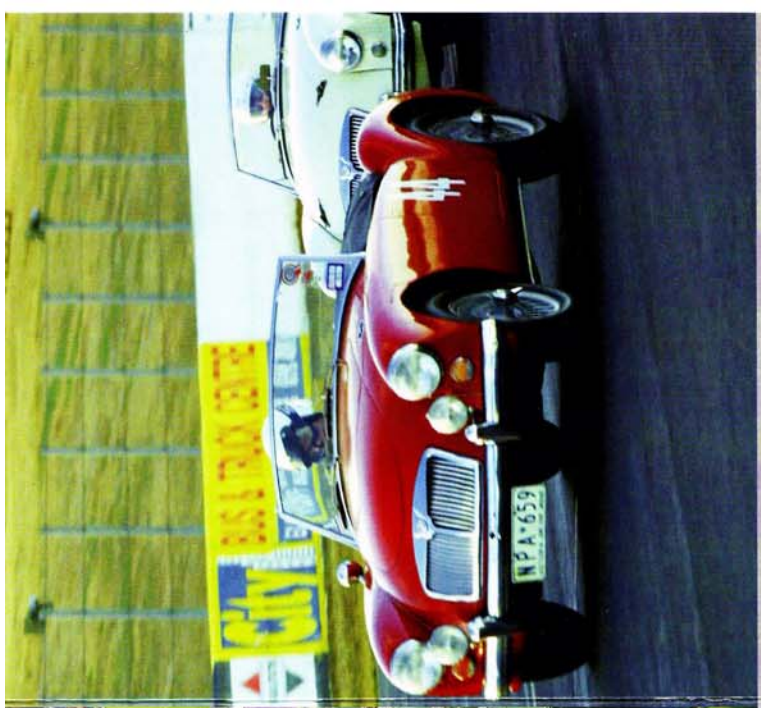
